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BOOK 2

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AC 4.2.10 (new for 2025)

Athletes eligible to participate in U10, U13, and U15 classes may only participate in their age class or the age class immediately above their age class. As an example, a U13 archer may participate in a U13 or U15 age class but not in a U18 age class.

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AC 4.5.7.0.2.2

Individual Finals Round:

- For the individual finals round, scores will carry over from the Qualification round total of 60 targets;
- Finals will be five (5) targets at varying distances and sizes;
- The TD will choose the targets and distances that archers will shoot during finals.
- The Finals will be shot on a Finals field.
 - One arrow per target;
 - One (1) minute to shoot one arrow;
 - Archers will be assigned one of the five (5) targets to start;
 - Archers will shoot and score their first target;
 - Archers will then rotate to the next target to shoot and score;
 - This is repeated until all five (5) targets have been shot;
 - For the **Individual Finals Only**, an arrow shot inside the 11 scoring ring scores 14 points unless the arrow breaks the line of the 11 rings, in which case it will score 11 points.

The highest three scores, Qualification plus Finals, after five targets, will be medalists;

Individual Finals Round:

- For the individual finals round, scores will carry over from the Qualification round total of 60 targets;
- Finals will be five (5) targets at varying distances and sizes;
- The TD will choose the targets and distances that archers will shoot during finals.
- The Finals will be shot on a Finals field.
 - One arrow per target;
 - One (1) minute to shoot one arrow;
 - Archers will be assigned one of the five (5) targets to start;
 - Archers will shoot and score their first target;
 - Archers will then rotate to the next target to shoot and score;
 - This is repeated until all five (5) targets have been shot;
 - For the **Individual Finals Only**, there will be a ring located ½ inch from top and right side of the 8 ring that will score 14 points. The size of the 14 ring will be 1.25 inch inner diameter. The rest of the rings score as normal.

The highest three scores, Qualification plus Finals, after five targets, will be medalists.

The format of the Canada Cups will be:

- Day 1 (Friday):
 - am – Official Practice and equipment inspection;
 - pm – Official Practice and equipment inspection;

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- pm – optional 720 round (does not count towards ranking for eliminations).
- Day 2 (Saturday):
 - am – 720 Ranking Round;
 - pm – Mixed Team Round.
- Day 3 (Sunday):
 - Individual Elimination and Medal Match Rounds:
 - No cut, all competitors advance to the Eliminations:
 - Eliminations/medal matches will only be held for categories with three (3) or more competitors;
 - In categories with less than three competitors, medals will be awarded based on the qualification round results.
 - Where appropriate, categories may be combined.
 - All match rounds are shot simultaneously;
 - Matches will be single elimination:
 - Canadian Double Eliminations are optional if the schedule permits.
 - Medal Presentations.
- All Archery Canada equipment Divisions recognised for Outdoor Target Archery apply.
- All Archery Canada age classes except U10, U13 and U15 apply

The format of the Canada Cups will be:

- All Archery Canada equipment Divisions recognised for Outdoor Target Archery apply.
- All Archery Canada age classes except U10, U13 and U15 apply
- Archery Canada age classes will be combined in each equipment division and gender as follows for qualification, eliminations, and medals:
 - U21 and Senior (21+)
 - U18 and 50+
 - For the Barebow equipment division, if there are fewer than three (3) athletes in a combined age class, the athletes will be further combined into a single age class, i.e. all barebow athletes will compete in a single age class
- Event Schedule:
 - Day 1 (Friday):
 - am – Official Practice and equipment inspection;
 - pm – Official Practice and equipment inspection;
 - pm – optional 720 round (does not count towards ranking for eliminations).
 - Day 2 (Saturday):
 - am – 720 Ranking Round;
 - pm – Mixed Team Round.
 - Day 3 (Sunday):
 - Individual Elimination and Medal Match Rounds:
 - No cut, all competitors advance to the Eliminations:
 - Eliminations/medal matches will only be held for combined categories with three (3) or more competitors;
 - Where a combined category has fewer than three competitors, medals will be awarded based on the combined ranking using the results of the qualification round
 - Para-classified athletes will be ranked and participate in the elimination round for the equivalent non-para equipment category
 - Medals will also be provided to para-classified athletes based on the rankings based on the results of the qualification round

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- All match rounds are shot simultaneously;
- Matches will be single elimination:
 - Canadian Double Eliminations are optional if the schedule permits.
- Medal Presentations.

The above event schedule may be modified as agreed between Archery Canada and the Organizing Committee.
