

Archery Canada - Aboriginal Policy

Approved by the Board of Directors

1) Introduction

- 1.1. Archery Canada recognizes and supports people of the aboriginal community in Canada to participate in all aspects of organized sport to the fullest.
- 1.2. Archery Canada in particular recognizes the special quadrennial event The North American Indigenous Games "NAIG" as the most important aboriginal sporting event in North America.
- 1.3. Archery Canada recognizes all athletes competing in these Games and views medal performances as a symbol of athletic excellence.
- 1.4. Archery Canada acts as liaison between the federal level and provincial sport governing bodies to increase and sustain dialogue in support of these quadrennial Games.
- 1.5. Archery Canada will continue to work with archers from the aboriginal community to address needs and issues as they arise.

2) Jurisdiction

This policy shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of Ontario.

3) Review and Approval

3.1. The Archery Canada Board of Directors and Executive Director shall review this policy every four (4) years on the Summer Olympic/Paralympic Games cycle.
