



Guidelines for Non-Olympic/Non-Paralympic Funding

Introductory Notes:

- These funds are derived from the collection of \$3/Archery Canada registrant fee. The distribution of the funds will be done at the beginning of every two year cycle, based upon the guidelines below and the specific eligible events occurring in those fiscal years (cycle: April 1, 2018 - March 31, 2020).

Guidelines:

- 1) Eligible events to receive funding include World Championships and Pan American Games only.
- 2) All non-olympic/non-paralympic national teams have access to these funds (Compound, 3D, Field, Youth teams).
- 3) The full support of one team leader per national team will be the top priority for funding (in the case where the team leaders are not already fully supported by other Archery Canada funds).
- 4) A reasonable "deductible" will be set for each funded athlete. This deductible will be a percentage of the costs and will be determined at the start of every two year cycle.
- 5) Archers selected to teams must be deemed competitive and committed (for example: regular participation in regional, provincial and national tournaments, ranked, capable of top half performance, meet qualifying score, have a coach/mentor.) This criteria will be determined annually for each eligible event by each respective committee.
- 6) Access to funding will be limited to big ticket items including travel to the event, accommodations, on-site transportation and registration only. It will not include meals, travel to airport from home, airport parking and will meet the travel funding standards as laid out in the Archery Canada [Financial Policy](#) specific to Travel and Accommodations (section 11).
