### **RECURVE Selection Addendum**

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#### **1. PAN AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIPS, MONTERREY MEXICO MARCH 22-29, 2020**

##### **1) Introduction**

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This document serves as a Selection Addendum to Archery Canada's Recurve National Team Selection Policy.

The purpose of this Addendum is to define the specific process and criteria used by Archery Canada to select the team of four (4) athletes that will compete at the the 2020 Pan-American Championships (PAC) and the team of three (3) athletes that will compete at the subsequent Tokyo Olympic Games Continental Qualification Tournament (CQT).

Archery Canada will have a singular focus on the women's competition and will thus not enter any senior men in the competition.

##### **2) Eligibility Criteria for the PAC and CQT**

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Team selection will be made pursuant to Archery Canada's Recurve National Team Selection Policy, as appropriate, and this Addendum. Eligibility requirements must be met as stated in the Selection Policy and this Addendum.

### **3) Decision Authority**

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Under the guidance of the HPC, the National Recurve Coach is accountable to select athletes and staff, for participation at events, in accordance with the Recurve Canadian Team Selection Policy and event specific criteria.

### **4) Team Size**

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The maximum number of archers Canada can enter in the Pan-American Championships is four (4).

The maximum number of archers that Canada can enter in the Tokyo Olympic Games, Continental Qualification Tournament is three (3).

### **5) Team Selection Procedure – Event Specific Criteria**

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#### **1. Defined Competition**

Athletes will be required to compete at a selection camp to be held on February 23-24<sup>th</sup>. The camp will contain components designed to simulate the following three types of competition:

- Ranking Round
- Individual Matches
- Team Round Competition.

The total score accumulated across the three competition components will be combined and divided by the total number of arrows shot by the individual athlete. The resulting average arrow value will be used to rank the athletes for selection to the teams:

1. The top three (3) archers will be selected to compete in the Tokyo Olympic Games Continental Qualification tournament (CQT).
2. The top four (4) archers will be selected to compete in the 2020 Pan-American Championships (PAC).

#### **2. Past Performance**

Due to the nature of the selection camp, the event will be limited to twelve (12) archers. Past performance will only be used if more than twelve (12) athletes register to compete at the selection camp. In this case, the registrants will be sorted according to their rank

in the Recurve Women category on the Archery Canada Ranking System as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019, and will be registered in rank order until all twelve (12) available spots have been filled.

For clarity: Archers do not need to be ranked within the top twelve (12) to register for the event. Archers ranked lower than twelfth may be able to compete at the selection camp, provided not all the archers ranked within the top twelve (12) have registered by the registration deadline.

Other than for the purpose of registration, Past Performance will not play any additional role in the event specific criteria used for selection to this team.
