

## QUALIFICATION SYSTEM FOR THE BIRMINGHAM 2021 WORLD GAMES ARCHERY

### Field archery

*The Birmingham 2021 World Games will include an individual field archery competition for recurve and barebow archers.*

| Category      | Quota places |

| Barebow women | 12           |

#### Quota allocation (listed in order of precedence)

- One (1) place for the host country (United States of America).
- One (1) place for the 2020 World Archery Field Champion.
- Ten (10) places on the final ranking list at the 2020 World Archery Field Championships.

A maximum of one (1) quota place will be awarded per country per category except for the places awarded to the host country and world champion, which are exempt from the maximum quota.

#### Quota reallocation

Any places that are returned will be reallocated on the final ranking list at the 2020 World Archery Field Championships.

### Target archery

*The Birmingham 2021 World Games will include individual and mixed team target archery competitions for compound archers.*

#### Quota allocation (listed in order of precedence)

- Ten (10) places awarded on the world ranking list as of 31 December 2020.
- Thirteen (13) places awarded at continental qualification tournaments (limited to top eight places in the final ranking).
  - Three (3) at the European Archery Championships in 2020.
  - Three (3) at an Asian qualification tournament in 2021.
  - Three (3) at the Americas qualification tournament in Medellin in 2020.

- Two (2) at an African qualification tournament in 2020/21.
- Two (2) at an Oceania qualification tournament in 2020/21.
- One (1) place for the host country (United States of America).
- One (1) place for a para athlete from the host country (United States of America).
- One (1) place for the para athlete that wins the individual compound open competition at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

A maximum of two (2) quota places will be awarded per country per category except for the para place awarded to the host country, which is except from the maximum quota.

A country qualifies a mixed team when that country has qualified at least one compound man and one compound woman.

### Quota reallocation

Places available at continental qualification tournaments are limited to the top eight in the final ranking. Places that cannot be allocated within the top eight will be reallocated on the world ranking list as of 31 December 2020 independent of continent.

If the athlete that wins the compound open competition at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games is from the United States of America then the place for the winner will be reallocated to the highest-ranked athlete in the competition that is not from the United States of America.

Any places that are returned or unable to be allocated will be reallocated on the world ranking list as of 31 December 2020.
