



## Internal Nomination Procedure (INP)

### For the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games

Tokyo, Japan: July 23 – 31, 2021

Re-Published Date: Oct. 27 2020

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

---

The Internal Nomination Procedure (INP) for Recurve for the 2020 Olympic Games is described by this event specific addendum to Archery Canada's [Recurve Team Selection Policy](#).

The initial purpose of this addendum was to outline any additional eligibility requirements and event specific criteria for selection to the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo, Japan.

This document was then amended following the postponement of the 2020 Olympic Games. All references below to the 2020 Olympic Games will refer to the Olympic Games in Tokyo taking place from July 23 – August 8, 2021.

This updated version of the Archery Canada INP was approved on September 25, 2020 and replaces the version of the INP approved on November 29<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and any other previous version of this INP as it relates to the Tokyo Olympic Games.

#### 2. PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

---

Based on significantly different performance levels demonstrated by our men and women athletes over the last quadrennial, Archery Canada's performance objectives for the Tokyo Olympic Games differ by gender as follows:

**For Men** - the INP is designed with the objective of achieving an Olympic podium performance in Individual or Team competition.

**For Women** - the INP is designed to enable qualification and to continue achieving representation at the Olympic Games.

### 3. TEAM SIZE

---

The team size will be determined by the number of quota spots allocated to Canada by World Archery (WA), to a maximum of three per gender.

**As of the INP publishing date, there is one (1) current Olympic quota spot allocated and confirmed for Canada's men.**

### 4. DISCREPENCIES & AMENDMENTS

---

In the event of changes by WA to the selection and eligibility criteria, Archery Canada will review and amend this INP as required to comply with new regulations or conditions.

Archery Canada is carefully following the evolution of the coronavirus on the global and domestic level and how it may impact obtaining quota spots for the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games and/or domestic nomination of athletes for the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. Unless otherwise required by exceptional and unforeseen circumstances related to the impact of the coronavirus, Archery Canada will respect these published Internal Nomination Procedures as written.

However, situations related to the coronavirus pandemic may arise that require this Internal Nomination Procedure to be modified. Any modifications will be made promptly and as often as required following developments that directly impact the Internal Nomination Procedure. In such circumstances, any modifications will be communicated to all affected individuals as soon as possible.

Further, situations may arise that do not allow this Internal Nomination Procedure to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional and unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including nomination decisions, will be made by the individual(s) with decision-making authority, as stated in this Internal Nomination Procedure, in consultation with the relevant individual(s) or committee(s) (as applicable), and in accordance with the stated performance objectives and selection philosophy and approach as

stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, Archery Canada will communicate with all affected individuals as soon as possible.

## 5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

---

To be eligible for nomination to the Selection Approval Panel, athletes must meet the eligibility criteria in the [Recurve Canadian Team Selection Policy](#) in addition to the following five (5) eligibility criteria:

1. Be a Canadian citizen in accordance with Rule 41 of the Olympic Charter and have a valid Canadian passport that does not expire on or before December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021.
2. Be in compliance with all relevant World Archery and IOC requirements for eligibility found at the following links:

3. Sign, submit and comply with the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) Athlete Agreement and the Tokyo 2020 Conditions of Participation Form prior to June 29th, 2021.
4. Be a member in good standing of Archery Canada as outlined in section 7 of the Archery Canada Membership Policy.
5. Comply in all respects with the Anti-Doping Rules of WA, the Canadian Anti-Doping Program ("CADP") and the Anti-Doping Rules of any other Anti-Doping Organization that has authority over them, and must not be serving a period of ineligibility or a provisional suspension for an antidoping rule violation;

## 6. NOMINATION PROCEDURES

---

### **A) General**

Team selection will be made pursuant to Archery Canada's Recurve National Team Selection Policy, as appropriate, and this Addendum. The National Team Selection Policy can be found at the following link:

Archery Canada will utilize its Selection Approval Panel process to confirm the nominations made by the National Coach. The Selection Approval Panel will consist of the following members:

- 1 Neutral Panel member
- 1 Archery Canada Board Member
- 1 Member of the Archery Canada High Performance Committee

## **B) Applicable Criteria**

Subject to the application of section 11 below, if necessary the following single criteria in section 4.1.1 from the Recurve Canadian Team Selection Policy will be used to support the nomination of eligible athlete(s) to the team:

## **Defined Competition(s)**

Competitions vary by gender, and by Automatic and Non-Automatic nomination as follows in sections 7 and 8.

## **7. AUTOMATIC SELECTION PROCESS**

---

### **For Women:**

The following two (2) 2021 Defined Competitions provide opportunities for automatic selection:

1. 2021 Pan American Championships, Monterrey, Mexico, March 2021
2. 2021 Final Olympic Qualification Tournament, Paris, France, June 2021

**Note:** *As of the INP publishing date, there are zero (0) quota spots allocated for women*

As of the date of publication of this INP, a Tokyo Olympic Continental Qualifying Tournament will be conducted in parallel with the Pan American Championships, Monterrey, Mexico (March 22 -28, 2021). If an individual quota spot is won in Monterrey, Mexico, the athlete who won the individual quota spot will automatically be nominated to the team. In the case that two (2) women secure the same quota spot, the highest final placing woman in the "Tokyo Olympic Continental Qualifying Tournament" will be nominated to the team. The second and third-highest placed women in the "Olympic Quota Spot Qualification Tournament" will be nominated as the first and second alternate.

As of the date of publication of this INP, the Final Olympic Qualification Tournament will take place in Paris, France from June 18-21, 2021. If an individual quota spot is won in Paris, France, the athlete who won the individual quota spot will automatically be nominated to the team. In the case that two (2) women secure the same quota spot, the highest final placing woman in

the "Final Olympic Qualification Tournament" will be nominated to the team. The second and third placed women in the "Final Qualification Tournament" will be nominated as the first and second alternate. In the event that less than three athletes attend the Final Olympic Qualification Tournament, additional alternates will be nominated based on their ranking in the Archery Canada Depth Chart.

If a team quota spot is won at the Final Olympic Qualification Tournament, the three (3) athletes who won the team quota spot will automatically be nominated to the team. The next highest ranked athletes in the Archery Canada Depth Chart will be nominated as the first and second alternate.

### **For Men:**

The following three (3) 2021 **Defined Competitions** provide opportunities for automatic selection:

1. 2021 World Cup 1<sup>st</sup> stage, Guatemala City, Guatemala, April 2021
2. 2021 World Cup, 2<sup>nd</sup> stage, Shanghai, China, May 2021
3. 2021 Final Olympic Qualification Tournament, Paris, France, June 2021 (Team Only)

**Note:** As of the INP publishing date, there is one (1) current Olympic quota spot allocated for men.

For the first two (2) stages of the World Cup (Guatemala and Shanghai) a three (3) step process will be followed to achieve Automatic Selection for the current **individual quota spot**:

**Step 1:** If an athlete achieves a top three (3) individual performance at one (1) or both of the first two (2) 2021 World Cup stages of the year (Guatemala or Shanghai) he will automatically be nominated to the team.

**Step 2:** If more than one (1) athletes achieves a top three (3) individual performance at the first two (2) 2021 World Cup stages of the year (Guatemala or Shanghai) the athlete who achieved the most top 3 finishes will automatically be nominated to the team.

**Step 3:** If more than one (1) athlete achieve an equal number of top three (3) individual performances, the Non-Automatic selection process will proceed, which will decide the nomination for the individual quota spot. The Non-Automatic selection process will also determine the nomination for the athlete alternates.

If a **team quota spot** is won at the Final Olympic Qualification Tournament, the three (3) athletes who won the team quota spot will automatically be nominated to the team. The next

highest ranked athletes in the Non-Automatic Selection Process will be nominated as the first and second alternates.

## 8. NON-AUTOMATIC SELECTION PROCESS

---

**Note:** The Non-Automatic Selection Process is applicable for Men only.

If, after the Automatic Selection Process, as defined in section 7, no nomination is made, and there are places remaining on the team, performance at the following Defined Competitions will determine non-automatic selection:

### **A Level Events**

- 1. Guatemala World Cup – April, 2021**
- 2. Shanghai World Cup – May, 2021**

### **B Level Events**

- 1. 2020 Chula Vista International Camp, February 2020 (completed)**
- 2. Q1 2021 Defined Training or Competition Camp 1 - Location TBD**
- 3. Q1 2021 Defined Training or Competition Camp 2 - Location TBD**

For each A Level event, defined Competition performance is measured across three (3) performance indicators as follows:

1. 720 Average Arrow Value (AAV) in Ranking Round performances
2. Match Play (AAV) performances
3. Final Tournament Placing (FTP)

Selection points are calculated for A Level events as follows:

$(720 \text{ Arrow Average}) + (\text{Match Play Arrow Average}) + (\text{FTP Points}) = \text{Selection Points}$

For each B Level event, defined Competitions performance is measured across (2) performance indicators as follows:

1. 720 Average Arrow Value (AAV) in Ranking Round performances
2. Match Play (AAV) performances

Selection points are calculated for B Level events as follows:

$(720 \text{ Arrow Average}) + (\text{Match Play Arrow Average}) = \text{Selection Points}$

**Note (a):** For B Level Events, not all competition components of the event may be included. Athletes will be notified of the INP relevant competition components for the events as soon as the event schedules become available

**Note (b):** In the event that one of the A Level Events indicated above is cancelled or Archery Canada is unable or decides not to attend one of these events due to health and safety reasons, the calculation as described below will be applied for the remaining A and B Level events. In the event that both A Level events are cancelled or Archery Canada is unable or decides not to attend both events due to health and safety reasons, Archery Canada will hold a single qualification tournament (which may be held domestically or abroad) with the four top ranking competitors from the B Level events. The selections point from this qualification tournament will be measured across the 720 AAV and Match Play AAV and will be added to the B Level events listed above to calculate the final rank order for nomination.

**For AAV:**

- 720 Round: The 720 AAV will be calculated by dividing the archers final score(s) in the 720 round(s) by 72.
- Match Play: The Match Play AAV will be calculated by adding the value of all arrows shot by the specific athlete in both the individual competition and the men’s team round competition (including tie breaks), divided by the total number of arrows scored in the corresponding rounds.

**For FTP:**

Final tournament placing points will be determined using the athletes Final Ranking according to the chart below. FTP results will be utilized exclusively for all A Level events.

Placing	Points
1st	1.0
2nd	0.9
3rd	0.8
4th	0.7
5th-8th	0.6
9th	0.5
17th	0.3
33rd	0.1

Overall athlete ranking to support the nomination will be calculated by adding an athlete's total selection points accumulated at the two A Level events with an athlete's best two performances from the three B Level events.

Athletes not attending, or posting scores, at one of the B Level events will be awarded zero (0) selection points for that event.

The grand total establishes the rank order for nomination to the Olympic Team, with the athlete ranked number 1 becoming the nominated athlete. The second and third ranked athletes will be nominated as the first and second alternates.

The following two (2) calculations provide examples of an applied calculation from the 2019 World Championships:

**Example Archer A (Mauro Nespoli, Worlds Championships 2019)**

720 Score: 691

Individual Match Total 477/51 arrows

Team Round Total 132/14

4<sup>th</sup> Final Place

Example A CALCULATION:

$$= (691/72) + (609/65) + (.7)$$

$$= 9.5972 + 9.3692 + .7$$

**TOTAL SCORE = 19.6664**

**Example Archer B (Ruman Shana, World Championships 2019)**

720 Score: 676

Individual Match Total 869/93 arrows

Team Round Total 146/16

3<sup>rd</sup> Final Place

Example B CALCULATION:

$$= (676/72) + (1015/109) + (.8)$$

$$= 9.3888 + 9.3119 + .8$$

**TOTAL SCORE = 19.5007**

9. NOMINATION DATES:

---

Nominations will be made as follows:

**D1) Women's Individual Spot:**

- Upon conclusion of the Olympic Quota Spot Qualification event in Monterrey, Mexico
- Upon conclusion of the Olympic Quota Spot Qualification event in Paris, France.



## **D2) Women's Team Spots:**

- Upon conclusion of the Olympic Team Quota Spot Qualification event in Paris, France.

## **D3) Men's Individual Spot:**

- On or before June 10th, and upon conclusion of the World Cup in Shanghai, China.

## **D4) Men's Team Spots:**

- Upon conclusion of the Olympic Team Quota Spot Qualification event in Paris, France.

## **10. WITHDRAWAL FROM THE TEAM**

---

Should an athlete nominated to the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Team, at any time between the sport entry deadline of July 5, 2021 and the sport technical meeting for the 2020 Olympic Games, decline his or her nomination or be declared unable to participate in a competitive manner, that athlete shall be replaced, subject to the approval of the COC Team Selection Committee, IOC Late Athlete Replacement Policy, and World Archery regulations, via the alternate process outlined below:

1. The designated first alternate will be substituted and nominated to the COC to replace that athlete provided they have met any minimum performance standards.
2. The second alternate will become the first alternate.

Substitutions between June 30th and July 4, 2021 will follow the process outlined above and are subject to approval of the COC Team Selection Committee.

## **11. INJURIES & UNFORSEEN CIRCUMSTANCES**

---

If an athlete is injured, ill, or otherwise unable to compete in more than one of the Defined Competition events listed in Section 7, Archery Canada may, in exceptional and justified circumstances, apply Section 5 of the Recurve Team Selection Policy, but only if doing so would support the performance objectives listed in Section 2 above.

## **12. OTHER DETAIL**

---

**Appeals:** Archery Canada's Appeals Policy will apply to any appeals related to the 2020 Olympic Games selections. The policy can be found here: [Archery Canada Appeals Policy](#).

For selection decisions made upon conclusion of the World Cup in Shanghai China, and the Final Olympic Qualification Tournament in Paris, France, appeals must be filed within 48 hours of the publication of the Olympic Team nomination.

If both parties are in agreement, the Archery Canada Appeals Policy can be bypassed, and the matter can be heard directly before the Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC).

**Decision Making Authority:** The decision-making authority for the 2020 Olympic Games includes the National Recurve Coach and the Selection Approval Panel as laid out in Archery Canada's Selection Policy and this addendum. Oversight for the implementation of the INP resides with the High-Performance Advisor. Decision making authority during the 2020 Olympic Games resides with the National Coach.

**Team Nomination and Announcement Dates:** The 2020 Olympic Games team will be selected and nominated to the COC no later than June 30th, 2021. Changes or updates to currently published information and dates, will be provided for any affected parties
