1. Introduction

This document serves as a Selection Addendum to Archery Canada's Recurve National Team Selection Policy.

The purpose of this Addendum is to define the event specific criteria used by Archery Canada to select the athletes, who will compete at the 2021 Final Olympic Qualification Tournament (FOQT).

All references below to the 2020 Olympic Games will refer to the Olympic Games in Tokyo taking place from July 23 – August 8, 2021.

2. Eligibility Criteria

Team selection will be made pursuant to Archery Canada's Recurve National Team Selection Policy, as appropriate, and this Addendum. Eligibility requirements must be met as stated in the Selection Policy and this Addendum.

3. Selection Authority

Under the guidance of the HPC, the National Recurve Coach is accountable to select athletes and staff, for participation at events, in accordance with the Recurve Canadian Team Selection Policy and event specific criteria.

4. Selection Details

A. Gender Specific Selection

For the FOQT, a separate selection process will be used for each gender.

B. Selection Timeline

Selection for the Final Olympic Qualification Tournament will be made on or before June 1, 2021

5. Team Size

The maximum number of archers Canada can enter in the FOQT is three per gender and additional non-travelling alternates.

6. Discrepancies & Amendments

In the event of changes by World Archery (WA) to the selection and eligibility criteria, Archery Canada is bound by these changes and will review and amend this document to comply with the new regulations or conditions.

Archery Canada is carefully following the evolution of the coronavirus on the global and domestic level and how it may impact World Archery Events and/or domestic nomination of athletes to compete at these events. Unless otherwise required by exceptional and unforeseen circumstances related to the impact of the coronavirus, Archery Canada will respect this published Selection Addendum as written.

However, situations related to the coronavirus pandemic may arise that require this Selection Addendum to be modified. Any modifications will be made promptly and as often as required following developments that directly impact the Selection Addendum. In such circumstances, any modifications will be communicated to all affected individuals as soon as possible. Further, situations may arise that do not allow this Internal Nomination Procedure to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional and unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including nomination decisions, will be made by the individual(s) with decision-making authority, as stated in this Internal Nomination Procedure, in consultation with the relevant individual(s) or committee(s) (as applicable), and in accordance with the stated performance objectives and selection philosophy and approach as stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, Archery Canada will communicate with all affected individuals as soon as possible.

7. Team Selection Procedure – Event Specific Criteria

A. Women

1. Defined Competition(s)

The following three (3) 2021 Defined Competitions provide opportunities for selection as outlined below.

1. 2021 Pan American Championships, Monterrey, Mexico, March 2021
 2. 2021 Gator Cup, Gainesville Florida, Spring 2021*
 3. 2021 Q2 Defined 720 Event, May-June 2021**
- a. Archery Canada will nominate up to three female athletes for selection to the FOQT based on the scenarios as outlined below.
 - i. If no Canadian woman secures Olympic Quota in Monterey Mexico, Archery Canada will nominate for selection, athletes who shoot a single (1) 720 score equal to, or greater than 643 at one of the Defined Competition(s), to a maximum of three (3) athletes.
 - ii. If a female archer obtains an Olympic Quota Spot in the Continental Qualification Tournament in Monterrey Mexico and is subsequently nominated to the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Team, AND at least two additional female archers achieve the criteria outlined in clause a.i. above, Archery Canada will nominate three female athletes to compete in the individual and team competition at the FOQT.
 - iii. If any three (3) female athletes collectively achieve a 1929 score at the same Defined Competition, Archery Canada will nominate three female athletes to compete in the individual and team competition at the FOQT.
 - b. Female athletes will be ranked for selection based on the following:
 - i. If no Canadian woman secures Olympic Quota in Monterey Mexico, archers will be ranked on their single highest 720 score from the Defined Competition(s).
 - ii. If a Canadian women secures Olympic Quota in Monterey Mexico, the corresponding archer will be ranked first for selection, the remaining individuals will be ranked on their single highest 720 score from the Defined Competition(s).

Note: * Situations related to the coronavirus pandemic may arise that could result in the cancelation of the Gator Cup event or significantly inhibit travel to the Gator Cup event, in such an instance athletes will be provided two scoring opportunities at the 2021 Q2 Defined 720 Event.

** The date and location of the 2021 Q2 Defined 720 Event will be provided once the international calendar has been solidified and with at least 60 days notice. The event may be either an open competition, or a structured simulation.

2. Physiology

Athletes must achieve Testing Standard Level Blue as outlined in the Archery Canada Fitness & Physiology Testing Protocol document which can be found here: <https://archerycanada.ca/wp-content/uploads/2019/10/2019-Fitness-Test-Protocols-For-new-site.pdf>

B. Men

1. Defined Competition

The selection to the FOQT for men will align to the process used in the Tokyo INP. That document can be referenced here: https://archerycanada.ca/wp-content/uploads/2020/10/Tokyo_INP.Sept25.AB_SR.pdf. In each scenario outlined below, the individual archer nominated to compete at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics will be a member of the three person team competing at the FOQT. The criteria below are intended to outline the process for selecting the two additional team members to compete at the event.

- a. Archery Canada will nominate to the team any athlete achieving a top 3 result in the individual or team competition at either of the first two stages of the 2021 World Cup Events.
- b. If after applying section (a) above, spots remain on the team, archers will be selected based on their rank in the "Non-Automatic Selection Process" as defined in the Tokyo INP.
- c. If after applying section (a) above, more than three athletes have qualified, archers will be selected based on their rank in the "Non-Automatic Selection Process" as defined in the Tokyo INP.

2. Physiology
