



Selection Addendum - Recurve Archers

World Archery Youth Championship (WAYC)

1. Introduction

General

Selection for the World Archery Youth Championships (WAYC) will be made pursuant to the Recurve Team Selection Policy. All athletes must meet the eligibility criteria as defined in the policy which can be found at the following link:

Age Eligibility

Junior recurve archers born in 2001 or earlier may compete in the Junior WAYC.
Cadet recurve archers born in 2004 or earlier may compete in the Cadet WAYC.

Categories

WAYC will have the following Recurve competition categories.

- a. Junior Women Individual
- b. Junior Men Individual
- c. Cadet Women Individual
- d. Cadet Men individual
- e. Junior Women Team (3 person team)
- f. Cadet Women Team (3 person team)
- g. Junior Men Team (3 person team)
- h. Cadet Men Team (3 person team)
- i. Mixed Junior Team (2 person team)
- j. Mixed Cadet Team (2 person team)

Objective

Archery Canada's performance objective is to finish in the top 32 or top half (if fewer than 32 competitors) at this tournament in any category in which Canada competes.

2. General Information

Canada can select up to:

- 3 junior men and 3 junior women, born in 2001 or earlier, and
- 3 cadet men and 3 cadet women, born in 2004 or earlier.

3. Selection Information

Selection of athletes for the WAYC will be pursuant to Archery Canada's Recurve Team Selection Policy, and utilize the criteria of :

- Defined Competition (4.1.1) and
- Past Performance (4.1.2) only.

For the 2021 WAYC, three opportunities for selection will be applied in the following order of priority:

3.1 Priority 1 - Automatic Selection (Podium Results Track PRT)

Athletes who achieve their Podium Result Track (PRT) score for their age, once, between January 1st, 2021 and August 15, 2021, in outdoor competitions registered with the organizations below, will automatically be selected to the team.

- Archery Canada and/or
- World Archery and/or
- Member organization of World Archery

If more than 3 athletes achieve their PRT number in a category, the 3 athletes with the highest score will be named to the team.

The required PRT scores are listed in the following chart.

For the purposes of determining age for the PRT, World Archery rules will apply.

Note: See Book 2 Rule 4.2.3 and 4.2.4 to determine PRT age. Example. An athlete turning 16 years of age within the year, will be considered 16 for the purposes of the PRT.

3.2 Priority 2 - Defined Competition Selection (2021 Canadian National Championships)

If there are positions remaining on the team in a given category, the winner of the 2021 Canadian Championships (July 17 -25, 2021 - PEI) in that category, will be selected to the team.

3.3 Priority 3 - Minimum Qualification Score Selection (MQS)

If there are positions remaining open in any category, the athlete(s) with the highest single 720 score at or above the MQS (shot between January 1 – August 15, 2021) will be selected to the team, starting with the highest score.

Note 1: If, for any of the 3 selection opportunities, there is a tie for the 3rd position in a given category, the next highest score achieved during 2021 will be used to rank and select the athletes.

Note 2: Archery Canada reserves the right to add additional athletes for the purpose of fielding competitive teams for the team competition portion of the event.

The 2021 World Archery Youth Championship Canadian Team will be announced on or before August 17th, 2021.

4. Discrepancies & Amendments

In the event of changes by World Archery to the event or the selection and eligibility criteria, Archery Canada will review and amend this Selection Addendum as required to comply with new regulations or conditions.

Archery Canada is carefully following the evolution of the coronavirus on the global and domestic level and how it may impact international competitions. Unless otherwise required by exceptional and unforeseen circumstances related to the impact of the coronavirus, Archery Canada will respect these published selection addendum as written. However, situations related to the coronavirus pandemic may arise that require this selection addendum to be modified. Any modifications will be made promptly and as often as required following developments that directly impact the selection policy. In such circumstances, any modifications will be communicated to all affected individuals as soon as possible.

Further, situations may arise that do not allow this selection policy to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional and unforeseen circumstances. In such situations any decision, including selection decisions, will be made by the individual(s) with appropriate decision-making authority, and in consultation with the relevant individual(s) or committee(s) (as applicable), and in accordance with the selection policy and the stated performance objectives for WAYC. Should it be necessary to make any decisions in this manner, Archery Canada will communicate with all affected individuals as soon as possible
