#### 1. Introduction

---

This document serves as a Selection Addendum to Archery Canada's Canadian Para-Archery National Team Selection Policy

The purpose of this Addendum is to define the event specific criteria used by Archery Canada to select the athletes, who will compete at the 2021 Final Paralympic Qualification Tournament (FPQT).

All references below to the 2020 Paralympic Games will refer to the Paralympic Games in Tokyo taking place from August 24 – September 5, 2021.

#### 2. Eligibility Criteria

---

Team selection will be made pursuant to Archery Canada's Canadian Para-Archery National Team Selection Policy, as appropriate, and this Addendum. Eligibility requirements must be met as stated in the Selection Policy and this Addendum.

### 3. Selection Authority

---

Under the guidance of the HPC, the National Coach is accountable to select athletes and staff, for participation at events, in accordance with the Canadian Para-Archery National Team Selection Policy and event specific criteria.

### 4. Selection Timeline

---

Selection for the Final Paralympic Qualification Tournament will be made on or before Monday June 7, 2021

### 5. Team Size

---

The maximum number of archers Canada can enter in the FPQT is three per category and additional non-travelling alternates.

### 6. Discrepancies & Amendments

---

In the event of changes by World Archery (WA) to the selection and eligibility criteria, Archery Canada is bound by these changes and will review and amend this document to comply with the new regulations or conditions.

Archery Canada is carefully following the evolution of the coronavirus on the global and domestic level and how it may impact World Archery Events and/or domestic nomination of athletes to compete at these events. Unless otherwise required by exceptional and unforeseen circumstances related to the impact of the coronavirus, Archery Canada will respect this published Selection Addendum as written.

However, situations related to the coronavirus pandemic may arise that require this Selection Addendum to be modified. Any modifications will be made promptly and as often as required following developments that directly impact the Selection Addendum. In such circumstances, any modifications will be communicated to all affected individuals as soon as possible.

Further, situations may arise that do not allow this Internal Nomination Procedure to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional and unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including nomination decisions, will be made by the individual(s) with decision-making authority, as stated in this Internal Nomination Procedure, in consultation with the relevant individual(s) or committee(s) (as applicable), and in accordance with the stated performance objectives and selection philosophy and approach as stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, Archery Canada will communicate with all affected individuals as soon as possible.

## 7. Team Selection Procedure – Event Specific Criteria

---

### 1. Automatic Selection

Any athlete qualifying a quota spot at the Continental Qualifier will automatically be selected to the event.

### 2. Defined Competition(s)

The following four (4) 2021 Defined Competitions provide opportunities for selection as outlined below.

### 3. Local Registered Round

Athletes may submit scores from Archery Canada Registered 720 Rounds (“Registered Rounds”). Athletes are eligible to select up to three (3) Registered Rounds from which they may submit a score for selection. Athletes must email the program coordinator no later than May 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 to identify the three (3) Registered Rounds they intend to compete at. The submission to the program coordinator must include the name, date and location of the Registered Round.

### 4. Recorded Round

Archery Canada understands that it may not be possible for archers to shoot scores in local events registered with Archery Canada because of regional COVID-19 restrictions. Due to various provincial restrictions leading to Archery Canada being unable to host an in-person trials, the establishment of an alternative score submission process has been implemented.

#### “Recorded Round”

For the purposes of National Team Selection during the current pandemic restrictions, a “Recorded Round”, has been created for eligible athletes to record and submit scores to the Czech WRE FPQT. “Recorded Rounds” are not eligible for the AC ranking list. The rules and regulations for the “Recorded Round” are in Appendix 1 of this document.

Note: Archery Canada may nominate for selection, to the FPQT athletes who shoot a single (1) 720 score equal to, or greater than the benchmark scores listed below, at one of the Defined Competition(s), identified Registered Rounds or a Recorded Round to a maximum of three (3) athletes per category.

- a. Athletes will be ranked for selection based on the following:
  - i. If no Canadian secures a Paralympic Quota in Monterey Mexico, archers will be ranked on their single highest 720 score from the Defined Competition(s).
  - ii. If a Canadian secures a Paralympic Quota in Monterey Mexico, the corresponding archer will be ranked first for selection, the remaining individuals will be ranked on their single highest 720 score from the Defined Competition(s).
  - iii. In the event there is vacancy per category following the completion of the listed Defined Competitions, the remaining individuals will be ranked on their single highest 720 score from a Local Registered Round or Recorded Round.

## APPENDIX 1 – THE “RECORDED ROUND”

---

Archery Canada understands that it may not be possible for archers to shoot scores in local events registered with Archery Canada because of regional COVID-19 restrictions. Due to various Provincial Restrictions and the inability to host an in-person trials, the establishment of an alternative score submission process has been implemented.

While we are encouraging participation where appropriate, Archers, the Designated Recorder and Clubs must strictly adhere to their local Provincial and Federal Public Health Orders, and keep up to date as they continue to change.

- The “Recorded Round” consists of 72 arrows shot at 50 metres for compound athletes and 70 metres (juniors & seniors) or 60 metres (cadets) for recurve athletes.
- The “Recorded Round” scores are not eligible for the AC Ranking list.
- Archery Canada rules will apply, except for rule 4.8.3.3. As a result, a “Recorded Round” can have as few as 1 archer or as many archers as the range can accommodate.
- Recorded Rounds pertaining to this selection document must be submitted to Archery Canada via the linked registration form (see below) no later than May 21, 2021
- Recorded Rounds must be submitted at least 48 hours prior to the time and date of the round.
- There must be a Designated Recorder (DR) in charge of the round, who meet one of the criteria listed below
  - an NCCP trained archery coach
  - a certified archery judge (any level of certification)
  - an Archery Canada certified Range Safety Officer.
  - A member of Archery Canada
- the DR is responsible for:
  - Submit intent to host a Recorded Round to Archery Canada no later than 48 hours prior to the shoot and no later than May 21, 2021 by registering online at: <https://forms.gle/WvEVAe1kBUS2wK7u8>
  - Submit the score(s), and a photo of each archers’ score card, signed by the archer and the DR, within 24 hours of the completion of the “Recorded Round” to the program coordinator. The score card must be legible, and the photo must be clear.
  - The “DR” must ensure that the range meets AC rules with accurate measurements and that target sizes and heights are correct. (Book 2, Chapter 7, 7.1.1.1 to 7.1.1.10 and 7.2.1 to 7.2.2.3).
  - Every effort should be made to have an AC judge at the event, although this may not be possible under local COVID rules and restrictions. If there is no AC judge, the DR is the judge and his/her decision is final.
  - If the DR has any questions, the DR may contact a judge for advice.

- “Recorded Rounds” can be shot on established ranges, practice ranges, or private property. **In all cases, the location must be compliant with the rules and safety regulations applicable to local bylaws and those of the Provincial/Territorial Association and Archery Canada. Archery Canada reserves the right to request an alternate location if it is not deemed acceptable under any of the preceding.**
- The “Recorded Round” must be shot according to the rules for the 720 Round as laid out in AC Rule Book 3 Chapters 11 to 14 with respect to Athlete’s Equipment, Shooting, Timing and Scoring.
  - If there is only one (1) athlete shooting the “Recorded Round”, either the judge or the DR will participate in scoring and will submit a photograph of each end of the archer’s score.
