



2022 Masters Pan Am Championships Selection Addendum

1) Introduction

This document serves as a Selection Addendum to Archery Canada's (AC) Recurve National Team Selection Policy and AC's Compound National Team Selection Policy.

The purpose of this Addendum is to define the event specific criteria used by AC to select the athletes who will compete at the 2022 Youth and Masters Pan Am Championships in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

2) Eligibility Requirements for the 2022 Masters National Team

Team Selection will be made pursuant to Archery Canada's National Recurve and Compound National Team Selection Policy, as appropriate, and this addendum. Eligibility requirements must be met as stated in the Selection Policy and this addendum.

To be selected as a Master for this event, eligible archers must meet the World Archery Age restrictions, therefore they will be 50+ in 2022.

3) Team Size

The maximum number of archers to be selected for the Men's and Women's Masters team is as follows:

- **Recurve:**
 - Women 4
 - Men: 4
- **Compound:**
 - Women 4
 - Men: 4
- **Barebow:**
 - Women 4
 - Men: 4

4) Team Selection Process

4.1 Ranking

The team will be selected based on the submission of (3) three Minimum qualification scores, as shot through a World Archery or Archery Canada Registered round and/or a Recorded Round as of October 15th 2021. A recorded round is a 72 arrow round, shot at the appropriate distance for your equipment category. This round is recorded as it is intended to allow flexibility for archers to obtain scores for selection, with ongoing COVID-19 restrictions. The Round can be shot at an appropriate facility, with at least (1) person acting as designated recorder. Please see [Appendix One](#) for the full format.

The team will be made up of the top 4 Men and top 4 Women in each equipment division that have reached a minimum ranking level, as outlined below in 4.2, or higher. Performance points will not be used for the 2022 ranking process due to COVID travel restrictions for events.

Eligible scores for submission can be from a World Archery or Archery Canada registered 720 rounds or a "Recorded Round" 720. Please see Appendix A for details outlining the "Recorded Round".



It is the archer’s sole responsibility to ensure the scores are kept up to date. The prospective team will be announced **October 18, 2021**, archers will have until **October 25, 2021** to challenge any of the selected archer’s placings on the 2021 rankings lists.

The selected archers will represent Canada at the 2022 Youth and Masters Pan Am Championships. If one of the top 4 archers chooses not to attend, that position will go to the next archer who has met the minimum requirements. This will continue until the list of qualified archers is exhausted. No other archers will be considered.

The selected archers will be required to sign the athlete’s agreement for 2022, as well as complete and submit all appropriate athlete documentation to the Archery Canada office, at least 3 weeks before attending an event as a National Team member. This includes, but may not be limited to:

- Athlete Medical Form - for emergency use
- Anti-Doping Training
- Respect in Sport/Safe Sport training

Archers will also be expected to produce a training schedule with a listing of tournaments they plan on attending in the lead up to the 2022 Youth and Masters Pan Am Championships.

4.2 Minimum Qualification Scores

Archers will be selected if they meet the following Minimum Qualification Scores or higher:

5. Selection Authority

Selection for the 2022 Youth and Masters Pan Am Championships team will be made in line with established Archery Canada National Team Selection policies using current competitive performance standards as set at World Archery Masters Events.

Selected archers will be nominated to a Selection Approval Panel. This panel will comprise of:

- (1) Archery Canada Board Member
- (1) Neutral Party
- (1) Member of the Archery Canada High Performance Committee

They will review the pool of athletes who have reached the minimum qualification score and have been nominated for selection. The Selection Approval Panel may elect to take fewer than the maximum number of permitted athletes. The panel will identify (1) non-traveling alternate per category and will be tasked with the monitoring process of selected athletes. The non-travelling alternate should be prepared to travel, if selected to the team

6. Performance and Maintaining Selection Status

Archers selected for the 2022 Masters Pan Am Championships will be expected to train and compete in the lead up to the Championships. Upon selection, they will be asked to complete and submit a training and competition plan that will outline their preparation for the event.

7. Team Organization

There will be one team from an organizational perspective, consisting of the selected athletes, coaches and/or team managers, nominated alternates (non-traveling), and any associated members for the Archery Canada team.

A team leader application process will be advertised to the community, with the team leader being notified and announced within 2 weeks of selection. Archery Canada will be



responsible for registering all archers and managers for the 2022 Youth and Masters Pan Am Championships, as well as making hotel, & transportation reservations for the team.

Once detailed information for the Championships is available, this will be communicated to the selected team in a timely manner.

8. Funding

At this time exact funding for this event is unknown. Archers should anticipate a portion of self-funding.

9. Disputes, Discipline, Complaints or Appeals

- The Chair of the Archery Canada High Performance Committee or his/her designate will settle any disputes concerning eligibility for Team selection.
- Concerns surrounding this Team Selection document are to be made to the Chair of the HPC Committee via the Archery Canada national office.
- Challenges regarding the implementation of this Team Selection document will be settled using Archery Canada's Appeal Policy.
- If an archer named to the Masters Pan Am Championships team fails to adhere to the terms and conditions of the Archery Canada Athlete Agreement, the Archery Canada Discipline Policy may be implemented.
- All discipline, complaints and/or appeals filed under Archery Canada's Discipline, Complaint or Appeal Policies and including appeals to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Centre, must be settled 30 days prior to the event. If there are differences between the English and French versions of this document, the English version will take precedence.

The Archery Canada High-Performance Committee reserves the right to make changes to this document, which in its discretion are necessary to ensure selection of the best teams possible for the 2022 Youth and Masters Pan Am Championships.

Any changes to this document shall be immediately communicated to all Archery Canada members with a special edition of the Archery Canada News (electronic newsletter published on the Archery Canada website). In the event of unforeseen or unusual circumstances, as determined by the Archery Canada HP Committee, the Archery Canada HP Committee shall have the full discretion to resolve the matter as it sees fit, taking into account factors and circumstances that it deems relevant. Any such exercise of discretion shall be subject to the Canadian administrative law principles of fairness.



Appendix One : Recorded Rounds

Archery Canada understands that it may not be possible for archers to shoot scores in local events registered with Archery Canada because of regional COVID-19 restrictions. Due to various Provincial Restrictions the establishment of an alternative score submission process has been implemented.

While we are encouraging participation where appropriate, Archers, the Designated Recorder and Clubs **must strictly adhere to their local Provincial and Federal Public Health Orders** and keep up to date as they continue to change.

- The “Recorded Round” will consist of 72 arrows shot at 50 metres for compound & barebow athletes or 60 metres for recurve athletes.
- The “Recorded Round” scores are **not eligible for the AC Ranking list.**
- Archery Canada rules will apply, except for rule 4.8.3.3. As a result, a “Recorded Round” can have as few as 1 archer or as many archers as the range can accommodate within Provincial Health Regulations.
- Recorded Rounds pertaining to this selection document must be submitted to Archery Canada via the linked registration form (see below) no later than Sept. 30th 2021.
- Recorded Rounds must be submitted at least 48 hours prior to the time and date of the round.
- There must be a Designated Recorder (DR) in charge of the round, who meet one of the criteria listed below:
 - an NCCP trained archery coach
 - a certified archery judge (any level of certification)
 - an Archery Canada certified Range Safety Officer.
 - A member of Archery Canada, who is 18 or older.
- the DR is responsible for:
 - Submitting intent to host a Recorded Round to Archery Canada no later than 48 hours prior to the shoot and no later than Sept. 30th 2021, by registering online at:

- o Submit the score(s), and a photo of each archers' score card, signed by the archer and the DR, within 24 hours of the completion of the "Recorded Round" to the Program Manager. The score card must be legible, and the photo must be clear. Scores and Scorecards should be submitted to:

- o If there is only one (1) athlete shooting the "Recorded Round", either the judge or the DR will participate in scoring and will submit a photograph of each end of the archer's score.
- o The "DR" must ensure that the range meets AC rules with accurate measurements and that target sizes and heights are correct. (Book 2, Chapter 7, 7.1.1.1 to 7.1.1.10 and 7.2.1 to 7.2.2.3).
- o Every effort should be made to have an AC judge at the event, although this may not be possible under local COVID rules and restrictions. If there is no AC judge, the DR is the judge and his/her decision is final.
- o If the DR has any questions, the DR may contact a judge for advice.
- "Recorded Rounds" can be shot on established ranges, practice ranges, or private property. **In all cases, the location must be compliant with the rules and safety regulations applicable to local bylaws and those of the Provincial/Territorial Association and Archery Canada. Archery Canada reserves the right to request an alternate location if it is not deemed acceptable under any of the preceding.**
- The "Recorded Round" must be shot according to the rules for the 720 Round as laid out in AC Rule Book 3 Chapters 11 to 14 with respect to Athlete's Equipment, Shooting, Timing and Scoring.
- Due to the ongoing impacts of COVID19 across Canada, Archery Canada holds the right to extend the recorded round submission deadline at any time as deemed necessary.
