



**ADDENDUM to CANADIAN TEAM SELECTION POLICY
for the
2022 PanAm CHAMPIONSHIP Barebow Team
Santiago, Chile
November 21-27 2022**

1) INTRODUCTION

This document is an Addendum to Archery Canada's 2022 Canadian Archery Team Selection Policy for individual and team events. The purpose of this Addendum is to define the specific process and criteria used by Archery Canada (AC) to select the WA Barebow archery athletes that AC will send to compete at the 2022 PanAm Championship, to be held in Santiago, Chile November 21-27, 2022.

Only four men and four women in the Barebow division in the Senior classes will be sent to the 2022 PanAm Championship.

2) DECISION AUTHORITY

Under the guidance of Archery Canada's High-Performance Committee (HPC), the Selection Approval Panel is the sole decision-making authority for the approval of nominations of athletes. The Selection Approval Panel will consist of:

- (1) Neutral Member
- (1) Archery Canada Board Member
- (1) High Performance Committee Member

3) ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA for the 2022 PanAm CHAMPIONSHIP - BAREBOW

To be eligible for selection to compete at this Championship, archery athletes must meet the eligibility criteria outlined below:

- Shoot a WA barebow.
- Be a Canadian citizen and have a Canadian passport.
- Have a valid Canadian passport that does not expire on or before May 1st, 2023.

- The athlete must have achieved the Archery Canada qualifying scores as outlined below in clause 4) B).

4) TEAM SELECTION PROCEDURES

A) PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVE

The objective of the team selection process is: Select athletes with a reasonable probability of finishing in the top quarter of the men's and women's competition.

B) CRITERIA

The following specific criteria will be used for the selection of barebow archery athletes to compete at the 2022 PanAm Championship:

- If an archer intends to participate in the 2022 PanAm Championships, they must make that intention known by email to the Field & Barebow coordinator by Aug 31, 2022.
 - Archers must shoot and submit a scorecard for two (2) registered 720 in the Junior or Senior Barebow division (AC /World Archery) or other World Archery member national associations (e.g., USA Archery) between May 1, 2022, and September 4th, 2022
- It is the archer's sole responsibility to submit qualifying scores to the Field & Barebow Archery Coordinator in a timely manner. Submit scorecards to Sean McKenty at: smckenty@archerycanada.ca A list of archers with submitted qualifying scores will be posted on the AC website as they are received.

Ties

- Any ties will be broken by total number of X's then 10's, then 9's etc

Ranking scores will be determined as follows:

The top four (4) archers and one (1) alternate with the highest average score equal to or above the minimum ranking scores.

The minimum ranking scores for selection are as follows:

- Men's Barebow: (500)
- Women's Barebow: (400)

The athletes meeting the above criteria, will be approved and notified by the AC Selection Approval Panel no later than September 15th, 2022.

5) APPEALS

Any eligible athlete wishing to appeal their omission from the National Team that will compete at the 2022 Pan Am Championships, must follow the Archery Canada Appeal Policy. To view the policy, go to: <https://archerycanada.ca/wp-content/uploads/2020/04/AC-Appeal-Policy.pdf>
