Considerations / Rationale:

- Participants directly under Archery Canada’s jurisdiction that can be objectively defined and traced

Tier 1 – National / International Participants

- Full-time status ~9-12 month of the year
- Travel to / from the event is considered in AC’s jurisdiction

Tier 2 – Event-Based National Participants

- Short-term (activities ~2-7 days in length)
- Travel to / from the event is NOT considered in AC’s jurisdiction
