

## REGIONAL INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

### General Information for Site Director, DOS & Judges

**THIS IS A NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP AND IT IS IMPORTANT THAT THE SAME PROCEDURES ARE USED AT ALL HOST SITES. THANK YOU FOR YOUR COOPERATION.**

**NOTICE: THIS IS A REGISTERED TOURNAMENT AND IS TO BE RUN AS PER CURRENT ARCHERY CANADA AND WORLD ARCHERY RULES, WHERE THERE IS A DISCREPANCY BETWEEN THIS DOCUMENT AND THE RULES, THE RULES TAKE PRECEDENCE!**

#### Archery Canada Registration

---

Competitors must be verified as current members of their Provincial / Territorial Archery Organization (PTSO) and registrants of Archery Canada in order to register for the Indoor Championships.

1. Anyone whose membership has not been renewed with their PTSO will be removed from the final individual and team results of the competition and will not be eligible to receive medals.
2. Non- Canadians must be members of another country's World Archery Member organization and they may compete in the guest category, however there are no medals for guest competitors.
3. It is suggested that archers register ahead of time, and register online with their appropriate PTSO. A registration station can be set up at your club if needed and or the club has capacity to do so (Wifi or internet access will be required).

#### Tournament Conduct

---

1. The Regional Indoor Championships may be organized by any Archery Canada Affiliated club. All host sites must be registered in IANSEO at least 1 week in advance of the Tournament weekend. A Provincial Association may notify the Archery Canada that it wishes to designate clubs to host the Championships, however all sites will be verified in advance with the PTSO.
2. Each host site may hold the tournament on either Saturday, Sunday or both days of the first complete weekend in March. Shooting should be completed by 7:00 p.m. local time on the day of the event.
3. In February, the designated site director for the registered site will be emailed a results entry Google Sheet link from Archery Canada to be used to record participants and their scores.
4. Indoor Archery rules apply as set under Appendix AC 3.3 of Book 2 (see the Archery Canada rulebook at <https://archerycanada.ca/resources/rules-book/>).
5. Remind everyone that the dress code is in effect and will be enforced.

6. A Provincial level judge is required at each host site unless an exemption has been granted.
7. The registration fee is determined by each host site, but must include the Archery Canada participation fees as set out below::

Age Division	Archery Canada Fee
Youth - U20, U18, U15, U13	\$5.00
Adult - 21+, 50+	\$8.00
Team(s)	\$15.00

8. All archers and teams should be registered in their correct categories using the Google Score Sheet form provided before the competition begins. Categories may not be changed after the competition begins unless the competitor has registered in an illegal category for his/her age or equipment.
9. There will be a minimum of 20 minutes and a maximum of 45 minutes of practice followed by a short break to put up targets etc. After the break, the first two ends will be 2-minute practice ends with archers on their own butts. The 2 practice ends are not required if the archers have been able to practice on their own target during the practice period. Arrow holes must be marked for these two ends (if they are shot) as targets do not necessarily need to be changed. There should be no breaks during the 60-arrow round except for washroom breaks and as necessary to change targets.
10. Host sites are not permitted to run the Archery Canada Regional Indoor Championship simultaneously with any other championship or tournament.
11. **OPTIONAL: Creating further awareness of archery in Canada is a high priority in order to grow participation in the sport. Please post photos or videos of the event to your club Facebook or Instagram page and tag Archery Canada. Invite local media to create more awareness of the sport of Archery in your community.**

## After the Tournament

---

1. Upon completion of your event, enter all scores into the Google Score sheet you were provided. This sheet is linked to the Live Master Score sheet, and will automatically populate all data and sort it in the live sheet. Ensure there are no errors.
2. **Deadline for submitting scores is Noon on the Monday following the event. Site Coordinator will have their access to their score sheets removed at this deadline.**

3. Following the event, Archery Canada will email the site director an invoice for all fees as well as a survey to complete to the Site Director. Please submit payment in the methods as outlined in the invoice, and complete the survey at your convenience.
4. **Keep** the original copies of the Official Scorecards until at least **March 31st**. Tournament results will be compiled using only the results (and score changes) which have been approved by the Site Director and sent to the Indoors Coordinator.
5. A Live score sheet will be posted by Archery Canada before the start of the event. Once all results are final, Archery Canada will post the final results online and through Social Media Channels. All results are considered unofficial until after the aforementioned deadline.

## CLUB TEAM EVENT

---

### APP3.4.1.2 Team Competition (club mixed team)

- A team will consist of three athletes all of whom are members of the same club. An athlete may compete on only one team.
- All teams must have at least one member who is the one of the following age categories: U21, U18, U15, U13, Woman or Para-archer athlete and no team may have more than one Masters or Senior shooting in the Compound, Bowhunter or Hunter Divisions.
- A team's score will consist of the aggregate score, tens and nines of all its members attained in the individual competition.

- Athletes on the same team must shoot their scores on the same day at the same site.

#### **APP3.4.3.3 Team Registration**

- Teams must register with the Host Site as prescribed by the Site Director.
- A team must be formed and registered before any team member shoots a scoring arrow. The team registration must include each athlete's category (age, sex and equipment division) and only scores shot in that category may be used. If a team member's category has not been specified, the first score shot following the registration of the team will be used.
- A club may register any number of teams; however only the highest scoring team from a club will be eligible for awards.
