

# Selection Addendum – Compound Archer’s World Archery Youth Championship (WAYC)

## 1. Introduction

This document serves as a Selection Addendum to Archery Canada’s Compound National Team Selection Policy.

The purpose of this Addendum is to define the event specific criteria used by Archery Canada to select the Youth Compound athletes, who will compete at the 2023 World Archery Youth Championships (WAYC) in Limerick Ireland.

## 2. Performance Objective

Archery Canada’s performance objective is:

### **U18 Women, U21 Women and U18 Men**

At minimum, finish in the Top 32 or top half (if fewer than 64 competitors) at this tournament in any category in which Canada competes. Final placings for Canada will be calculated based on Average Arrow Value in match play.

### **U21 Men**

At minimum, finish in the Top 16 at this tournament in any category in which Canada competes. Final placings for Canada will be calculated based on Average Arrow Value in match play.

### 3. Discrepancies & Amendments

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In the event of changes by World Archery (WA) to the selection and eligibility criteria, Archery Canada is bound by these changes and will review and amend this document to comply with the new regulations or conditions.

Archery Canada is carefully following the evolution of the coronavirus and other infectious diseases, on the global and domestic level and how it may impact World Archery Events and/or domestic nomination of athletes to compete at these events. Unless otherwise required by exceptional and unforeseen circumstances related to the impact of these diseases, Archery Canada will respect this published Selection Addendum as written.

However, situations related to the infectious disease may arise that require this Selection Addendum to be modified. Any modifications will be made promptly and as often as required following developments that directly impact the Selection Addendum. In such circumstances, any modifications will be communicated to all affected individuals as soon as possible. Further, situations may arise that do not allow this selection addendum to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional and unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including nomination decisions, will be made by the individual(s) with decision-making authority, as stated in this selection addendum, in consultation with the relevant individual(s) or committee(s) (as applicable), and in accordance with the stated performance objectives and selection philosophy and approach as stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, Archery Canada will communicate with all affected individuals as soon as possible.

### 4. Age Eligibility & Registration

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Team selection will be made pursuant to Archery Canada's Compound National Team Selection Policy, as appropriate, and this Addendum. Eligibility requirements must be met as stated in the Selection Policy and this Addendum. Age eligibility is as follows:

- **U21** compound archers born in 2003 or earlier may compete in the U21 WAYC.
- **U18** compound archers born in 2006 or earlier may compete in the U18 WAYC.

### **Intent to Compete Registration & Score Submission**

Any athlete that meets the age criteria in section 4 that would like to be considered for selection to the Canadian compound team that will compete at the 2023 WAYC must register their intention to compete by April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Please use online registration form below to register:

## 5. Categories and team size

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Based on meeting Minimum Qualification Score eligibility as per section 5.1, Archery Canada may select up to 3 athletes in the following Compound competition categories.

1. U21 Women Team (3-person team)
2. U18 Women Team (3- person team)
3. U21 Men Team (3 -person team)
4. U18 Men Team (3 -person team)

### 5.1 Minimum Qualification Score (MQS)

To be eligible for selection and as per the below chart 1, athletes must have shot at least one registered\* score in the U21 (Junior) or U18 (Cadet) category between May 1<sup>st</sup> 2022 and 15<sup>th</sup> 2023.

*\*Registered Score is defined as nationally or internationally sanctioned by Archery Canada or a World Archery member national association (e.g., USA Archery) 720 Round.*

#### Chart 1: MQS

720 Benchmark scores are determined by the combined Average Arrow Value (AAV) of 720 and matchplay scores of the Top 32 final ranking athletes at the 2017, 2019 and 2021 World Youth Archery Championships

## 6. Selection Details

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Selection for the 2023 (WAYC) will be made on or before May 17, 2023

### 7. Primary Team Selection Procedure

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Athletes will be selected based on total ranking points (highest 720 score + MPP) on the event selection ranking list as of May 15, 2023. Athletes will be ranked on the addendum specific ranking list in order based on their 720 score plus any additional match play performance points earned during the eligibility period (see item 5.1).

#### 7.1 Tie-break

If two (2) or more athletes are tied with the same ranking points, the following tie-break procedures will be used. If athletes are tied in their respective category ranking, and if there are fewer spots than archers who qualify based on the prioritization outlined in section 5.0, the athlete's match score AAV on the will be used Selection Addendum Ranking List.

## Match-play Performance Points (MPP)

Athletes are eligible to submit up to three (3) Match Play Scores from 'Major Events' to obtain a maximum of 15 additional performance points. Match Play Performance Points will be added to the athletes 720 round score. The following chart outlines potential performance points earned based on matchplay score submission:

### Event Definitions

Major Events - Archery Canada National Outdoor Target Events, Identified National Training Camps, Canada Cup(s) & Outdoor Target National Championships, USA Archery USAT Events, World Archery World Ranking Events.

Local Events - Nationally Sanctioned (registered) Archery Canada or World Archery member national association (e.g., USA Archery) 720 Round.

### 9. Secondary Selection

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Following the primary selection process, if fewer athletes than spots available have achieved selection criteria the High-Performance Director, supported by the Compound Program Coordinator and the Selection Approval Panel may select athletes to the team.

### 10. Fees & Event Levies

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The approximate estimate for travel per athlete to this event is \$4,200 CAD (*Please note, this estimate may be subject to change*). Archers named to the team will be provided travel funding in a tiered priority based on selection ranking. Archery Canada will organize and make initial payment on behalf of athletes for travel (flights and local transport), event registration fees, and accommodations (food and dorm rooms). Athletes will be required to pay Archery Canada an event levy based on their tier selection.

Tiered funding will be determined based on two priorities, first is meeting the below listed MQS (720 + MPP) score per tier. The second is by team rank, if one or more athletes

- Tier 1: Event Levy owed by athlete is approximately \$3,450 (or funding up to 18%)
- Tier 2: Event Levy owed by athlete is approximately \$3,700 (or funding up to 12%)
- Tier 3: Event Levy owed by athlete is approximately \$3,950 (or funding up to 6%)
